WCCSE Policies:

Discussion: In the fall Connie, Loren, and Kristin will attend the County Superintendent Round Table Meeting to bring in more support for the Schools. (Will give handouts)

Nurse Coverage at Events:

- -WCCSE does not provide a nurse at field trips; be aware and attentive to the needs of your students
 - -Epi-pens must be accompanied by trained delegates or nurse
 - -All school groups must follow state medication guidelines.

WCCSE Policy is that ALL EVENTS are NUT FREE! Please include this in all paperwork and registrations.

Eligibility:

NJDOE is now presenting conflicting information on the use of PARCC scores as an identification measure for gifted programming eligibility.

PARCC: Bill A-4190 prohibiting such use is still in review; however, NJDOE info on PARCC FAQ for parents suggests a local decision.

Use caution in such decisions. If the bill does pass, decisions could be challenged later.

Insight Testing

Knowlton found the results to be unreliable. Pohatcong- will continue to use the program with 2nd and 5th

Insight Testing: Discounted price \$8/child for districts that participated in pilot; \$10/child regular price for 2015-2016. G&T tests are only 3 sections, the full battery is approx. 8 sections.

General guidelines: Multiple measures, must begin in kindergarten, must measure against local cohort, balance objective with subjective information, use caution when requalifying. (If you have a re-qualifying policy, be careful if you cut a student from a program as parents can challenge your techniques.)

Equity:

At Confratute, it was suggested that students who are grouped as economically disadvantaged (Free and Reduced Lunch) should have their standardized scores viewed on a different scale representative of the fact that many of our economically disadvantaged students do not have the opportunities that others might have. le, summer camps, private lessons, etc. Recommendation: 75%ile viewed as 95%ile

Are our gifted-identified groups representative of our school demographics?

- -Do you have a G&T grouping that matches the school population?
- -For fall, Kristin will provide a recording form and would like each school to provide data for overall analysis of representation.

Parent/ Teacher Seminars

January 2016: Igniting Motivation with Alison Brown
